From the Desk of Rev. Diana

What a wonderful world! If you were stranded on a deserted Island and could only take one song with you to hear for the rest of your life, what song would you pick? Is it a church hymn or something you learned as a child? Maybe that special song from your prom or wedding?

The song I would pick is What a Wonderful World. written by Bob Thiele (as "George Douglas") and George David Weiss. It was first recorded by Louis Armstrong and released in 1967 as a single. In a time when our country was in turmoil over racism and the loss of John F Kennedy. George Weiss says he wrote the song specifically for Louis Armstrong, as he was inspired by Armstrong's ability to bring together people of different races. Thiele said that the song was intended as a reassuring antidote to the mounting problems facing America in the late 60s; a time defined by what he described as "the deepening national traumas of the Kennedy assassination, Vietnam, racial strife, and turmoil everywhere." The song was a flop in the US as Larry Newton, the president of ABC, hated the song and wouldn't promote it. It hit the charts in the UK reaching No.1 during a 29-week run.

It finally became popular in the US in 1988 when it appeared on the soundtrack of *Good Morning Vietnam*. It was introduced to the Grammy Hall of fame in 1999. I love this song because it reminds me of the beauty of the gift of life

The last verse speaks of the hope that those who come after us will know more about love than we know. Perhaps they will be able to appreciate and care for this beautiful world in a better way.

For Armstrong, it told a story of possibility. In the 1970 recording of this song there is a spoken introduction by Louis:

"Some of you young folks been saying to me," Hey Pops, what you mean 'What a wonderful world'?

How about all them wars all over the place? You call them wonderful?


And how about hunger and pollution? That ain't so wonderful either."
