#### Holy Nativity Book Club

The Holy Nativity Book Club started last October and had a very successful first year. We utilized the Weymouth Public Library for books, online access to Ebooks and spoken versions as well as commercial Eproviders. Each book, readings and poetry focused on Silence, which we agreed takes many forms. We reflected how silence has shaped us individually in our past and present lives.

The book of the month in May focused on silence in the Boston homeless community. Stories from the Shadows by Dr Jim O'Connell revealed how the homeless will infrequently or never reveal anything about their lives. Father Brad and Shirley Devore joined us to share their experience of weekly outreach trips to Boston bringing food, drink, clothing. hygiene products and kind words to this marginalized community. Our group donated many pairs of new socks to help support the mission.

We now move into 2023-2024 and members of the club have been invited to choose a book (or any form of writing) of their choice and lead discussions. A reading list will be available in October for anyone who is interested.



HOLY HAPPENINGS

- 12 oz (~2 cups) semi-sweet chocolate pieces
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Grease a 9-inch square baking pan; set aside. In large saucepan combine first 5 ingredients. Stir over low heat until blended. Increase heat to medium and bring to a full-rolling boil being careful not to mistake escaping air bubbles for boiling. Boil slowly, stirring constantly,  $3\frac{1}{2} - 5$  minutes to the soft ball stage\*. Remove from heat, stir in semi-sweet chocolate pieces until they are melted. Stir in vanilla. Add nuts. Turn into greased pan and cool.

Makes 2½ pounds.

\*The soft ball stage is a test to see if the fudge has been cooked to the proper stage. Before you start cooking, fill a small dish with ice water and set aside. After you have brought the recipe to a full boil for 3½ minutes, dribble a few drops of the mixture into the ice water from a wooden spoon. After it cools in the water (<u>about</u> 10 seconds), you should be able to roll it into small ball with your finger tips. If you put it in your mouth, it will be slightly chewy. If it passes these tests, you are done and should remove the mixture from heat and add the remaining ingredients. Otherwise, cook for another 30 seconds and try the test again. Most of the time, cooking time will not exceed 5 minutes.

Hint: As with all fudge recipes, cooking time will vary depending on factors such as humidity, altitude, and cooktop temperature.
